DISEASES WITH THE TELEPHONE SYMBOL ☎ MUST BE REPORTED WITHIN 24 HOURS OF A SUSPECT DIAGNOSIS.
All other diseases should be reported within 3 working days after identification.

ALSO REPORTABLE

- **Pregnancies** associated with the following diseases, even if the disease was reported to public health prior to the pregnancy:
 - Hepatitis B
 - Hepatitis C
 - HIV
 - Listeria
 - Rubella
 - Syphilis
 - Zika virus infection
- **Any** exposure/infection that may indicate a bioterrorism event
- **Any** unusual diseases or outbreaks

A completed morbidity form (page 2) may be mailed, emailed, faxed, or called in (voice mail is confidential)

NOTE: Email reports should be sent encrypted through a secure mail system. Unencrypted reports risk breach of confidentiality.
