




UTAH COUNTY SHARE OF STATE POPULATION GROWTH, 2023-2024





EMERGENCY **PREPAREDNESS &** RESPONSE

This team works closely with Utah County Emergency Management. They maintain relationships with medical and response partners is case of emergency and routinely respond to issues within Utah County to help keep our county safe and healthy.

ENHANCED COLLABORATION

We've teamed up with the Communications (Comms) team and now share office space with them in the Health and Justice Building. This partnership helps us communicate faster and more effectively during emergencies.

We're also proud to continue working closely with Utah County Emergency Management. For the past five years, this collaboration has helped us respond more efficiently and access additional emergency resources when needed.

SHARING OUR WORK NATIONALLY

We were honored to present on our partnership with Utah County Emergency Management at the National Healthcare Coalition Preparedness Conference.

VOLUNTEERS & EVENTS

Our Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) coordinator has been busy organizing events and boosting volunteer participation. Our volunteers assembled over 200 Stop the Bleed kits in a single day!

We stay actively involved in community and regional preparedness efforts:

- Local and state emergency readiness drills and exercises

STOCKPILE & RESOURCES

Our stockpile of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE is be ready for use during health emergencies.

REAL-WORLD COORDINATION

While we didn't experience any full-scale emergency deployments this year, we remained ready and responsive. Hospitals in our area faced power, heating, and cooling issues, and we were alerted to the situations and stood by with equipment support.


One notable response involved a hospital water outage, where the coalition—working closely with Utah County Emergency Management—provided water filtration equipment and supplies to help maintain safe operations. It was a great example of collaboration and rapid response in action.

FULL-SCALE FEDERAL EXERCISE

We took part in the Ultimate Caduceus Full-Scale Exercise, a federal emergency drill where over 50 simulated patients were flown from Washington to Salt Lake City. The exercise tested and strengthened coordination efforts for patient reception and hospital transport across Utah.

This team keeps the county prepared by planning, training, running drills, and coordinating with healthcare partners and volunteers. They manage medical supplies and respond quickly during emergencies.










INFORMATICS




